# SUMMER CAMP THE PLAN!

The Summer Camp Committee is diligently working on plans for the return of on-site campers and volunteers this summer. We know that the final decision will be out of our hands depending on the course of the pandemic, the roll out of the vaccination program, and the related public health recommendations and government regulations. All that being said, we are moving forward in faith and trust in the Lord and continue to make our plans "the Lord willing"!

During a Pandemic we have adopted 4 P's to help us strategize for a successful camp season:

### 1. PRAYER

This is not a new one for Campfire but is always the right starting point for any of our plans, whether on a big scale, or simply in starting a new day or a new activity at camp. As we plan, we ask you to be in constant prayer with us for the possibility to have an on-site summer camp this year. We know that our Father in heaven loves us and wants us to share the good news of Jesus. We also know that he opens the way, sometimes very unexpectedly.

"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who

## 2. PROTOCOLS

One thing we have all learned about a pandemic is that you have to have a well thought out system to manage the spread of a virus. We are thankful that all the levels of governments and their related public health agencies have provided us with these safety recommendations which may include:

- Pre camp screening
- · Nursing staff on site
- Hand washing stations throughout the property
- Fun "camp-like" ways to ensure hygiene practices
- · Site cleaning
- Contact tracing
- Symptom monitoring
   daily meetings
- Branded masks and sanitizers on hand
- Government guidelines (including vaccination information)
- Programming adjustments based on government guidelines – e.g. meals, swimming, etc.

# 3. PACKS

Grouping camp members in cabin packs is a very familiar activity already for campers and counsellors. These packs will serve in the same

way as classroom cohorts work at school. They will help in some of the following ways:

- Reducing the total number of people that a camper is in contact with
- Keep campers/counsellors with their cabin pack for creative programming and masked and physically-distanced for meals, chapel and campfires
- Daily cabin maintenance cleaning protocol will depend on property regulations
- Big games will have to include cohorts and masking
- Travelling off site will be reviewed to see if it can conform

## 4. PARAMETERS

Campfire has always worked within parameters which include camp capacity, ratio of campers to counsellors, as well as the number of staff members and volunteers required. During the pandemic we realize that the parameters will shift, largely based on the government recommendations. The SCC is prepared to pivot the parameters in some of the following areas:

- Lowering total occupancy capacity to allow for physical distancing on camp property
- Manage a "wait list" for campers, counsellors and volunteers
- Innovate the camp weekly programming to help achieve the safety goals without sacrificing the fun
- Ensure that the sponsorship partnerships we have for campers are well prioritized
